



Southwest Durham County and Southeast Chapel Hill Collector Street Plan- Final Public Workshop

What are These Maps?

The Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) is developing a collector street plan for southwest Durham County and southeast Chapel Hill. If you received this notice in the mail, it is very likely that you live in, or next to, the study area. Enclosed are three documents illustrating the Revised Southwest Durham/Southeast Chapel Hill Collector Street Plan:

- A map of the Revised Collector Street Plan Network;
- A close-up map of the NC 54 corridor from the Revised Plan Network; and,
- A one-page “flyer” providing an overview of the Plan purpose, key points and recommendations.

When is the Final Public Workshop?

The final public workshop will be held October 10, 2006 and will present the proposed collector street network for your response and comments. Please review the enclosed information, and come out to participate. The workshop will be held at Creekside Elementary School, 5321 Ephesus Church Rd., Durham, NC 27707. You can drop in anytime from 6:30PM to 8:30PM to discuss the collector street plan with staff – there will be a short presentation at 7:00PM to review the plan. We'll see you there!

What are the Next Steps?

Local planning staff and a consultant team developed the proposed Collector Street Plan based on public input received at a series of three public workshops and a public hearing conducted from October 2005 through June 2006. Staff will make additional revisions to the Plan based on this final public workshop, and then present the final Plan to the Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) for adoption. The TAC is the DCHC MPO governing board that is comprised of County and municipal elected officials, and could adopt the final Plan as early as December 2006. Planners, developers and the local community will use the adopted Plan to design and review proposed developments.
