[Re: Durham Inventory Local Action Plan, Draft 8]

Members of the Advisory Committee and Technical Team:

Please find attached the current draft of Durham's GHG and CAP Inventory and Local Action Plan. This document is an amendment to the drafts you have seen in our previous meetings. As it is lengthy and much of the document remains unchanged, we would like to highlight major points for you to consider while reviewing the draft before our next meetings. There have been several slight changes to the draft but the major ones for you to review include:

- 1) The addition of school data as a sixth sector within the corporate inventory (page 34).
- 2) The quantification and addition of several historic and planned emission reduction measures (page 48). These measures have had a slight effect on the planned emission reduction forecast scenarios (community: page 42, corporate: page 45).
- 3) The addition of Chapter 6: *The Local Action Plan* (page 53). You should focus on this chapter while reviewing the document. This chapter reviews emission reduction efforts in Durham, highlights ways in which further emission reductions can be achieved, provides case studies and recommends future actions for each sector. This chapter also demonstrates what levels of emission reductions are achievable through different levels of commitment (low, medium and high) in each sector, and cumulatively. This chapter also discusses implementation issues such as: financing, departmental responsibilities, and monitoring.
